Behind The Lens: Highlighting Concert Photography

Retired from the Printing Industry, I've been interested in shooting musicians for many years, mainly in the blues genre. Generally, if you see me at your event it's because I like the music! My style is to catch a moment and accentuate it to focus on the artist. It's not a journalistic style, but more artistic as I will crop, clone, alter the images to suit my style. I'll strive to get the angle that catches your eye and pop it up.

Sometimes a Black and White image will convey a feeling better than colour. Being at the mercy of the lights/lighting means dealing with post processing nightmares, but that just gives me incentive for the challenge. I shoot at festivals/events and small clubs and travel to see many blues musicians in many settings.

Having met and become friends with these musicians over the past 20 years they've become comfortable with seeing me and my camera. Shooting mainly Pentax, I've recently entered the compact camera category with a Sony mirrorless which gives me some advantage in low light situations. Either way, I always have a camera with me for that moment.




