The Grand River Blues Society Road To Memphis Competition 2023

The Grand River Blues Society is a non-profit organization founded in 2003 and its sole purpose is to feature and sustain blues music in South Central Ontario. Recognizing that music has no boundaries, The Grand River Blues Society is expanding to reach new blues loving regions.



Blues fans came out in droves to witness an epic showdown – The Road To Memphis Competition at Stonewall's Restaurant in Hamilton on March 27th. A solid afternoon of 7 great professional bands laying it on the line for the chance to compete in The International Blues Challenge in Memphis in 2023. A sold-out crowd witnessed an afternoon of great blues licks, thanks to the involvement of the Grand River Blues Society.



First up was the *Paul Coombs Blues Band* who kicked off the afternoon with a solid rocking set. Formerly called Blueswinder, this Hamilton-based band had the crowd into the music from their first note. Led by Paul Coombs on guitar, this band showed true professionalism. Paul Coombs has been writing and producing music for over 25 Years and the tunes the bands played are a testament to that talent.



Then *Riley Michaels* took to the stage. He's only 21 but he sure knows how to capture an audience. His onstage presence and exuberance thrilled the audience. He sure gave his running shoes a workout as he danced and sang his heart out on stage. He's a perfect example of why the future of music is on solid ground. He's mainly thought of himself as a pop artist, but his performance proves he can navigate in the blues world.



Frank Cosentino Band

Frank Cosentino must've been born clutching a guitar. Few guitar slingers scan match his shredding and he's been bending steel ever since he saw Jimi Hendrix live in Toronto in 1968. For over 40 years he's been front and center in the blues scene and his dedication landed him in The Blues Hall of Fame. And not only is he a consummate performer and songwriter, but he's a passionate guitar teacher, passing on information and talent to the next generation of performers.



Bywater Call

Bywater Call burst upon the blues scene with a debut album in 2019 and garnered a Maple Blues Award for Best New Artist and they're currently working on a new album release coming this spring. Led by vocalist Meghan Parnell and guitarist Dave Barnes the seven-piece band is about to tour Europe in May. From the opening notes, the audience was enraptured with the performance. When the band started up, the audience in Stonewall's started to rock with the music.



Garnetta & Dagroovmasters

Garnetta Cromwell is a bilingual, Indigenous Black Canadian vocalist who takes the stage by storm. Backed by a tight band she had the audience eating out of her hand. The dancing shoes broke out and she led the audience in blues-funk grooves. It was high-energy performance that left the audience wishing there was time more.



Long Black Cadillacs

It's an apt name for the band cause they brought some luxury music to the stage. They're a Hamilton based band led by Earl Johnson who comes with a ton of experience. Not only was the guitar slinger for the Moxy and also toured with King Biscuit Boy. Chris Jackson's vocals captured the ears of the audience. The band has begun recording an album and has released a couple of singles that are garnering interest.



Jim Dan Dee

The final band that took the stage was Jim Dan Dee. The band, led by Jim Stefanuk is affectionately known as J.D.D. And they sure gathered up some new fans during their performance. Jim's crystal-clear baritone vocals blend marvelously with his razor-sharp guitar playing. The four-piece band closed the day with a rousing performance.



It was a at a great afternoon of rockin' blues tunes. The judging committee had to make some tough decisions but finally the results were announced. The winner? BYWATER CALL!

Bywater Call will be going to Memphis in 2023 and are sure to make the Grand River Blue Society proud!

ARE YOU READY ! GRAND RIVER BLUES CAMP ... IT'S BACK !!!

August 2 – 5, 2022 8:30a.m.-3:30p.m.

Cameron Heights Collegiate, 301 Charles St. E. Kitchener, ON (LRT at the door)

Like everything else around the globe, for the past two years the pandemic prevented the GRBS Blues Camp from taking place. Every year for the previous eleven, the week immediately prior to the TD KBF saw 50+ students and approximately a dozen amazing local musicians, jamming in empty School Board classrooms, learning how to play instruments, sing songs, and become musicians in a band and performance context.

2020 was to have been the 20th anniversary of the TD Kitchener Blues Festival and the 11th for the Camp. Springing forward to 2022, we're re-setting the clock and going for broke! Dennis Cuomo and George White, along with long time Musical Director Don Featherstone, Camp Directors Janet Wendell and Neil Tarswell as well GRBS representative Brenda Thyer, have been busy! On their work roster have been the tasks of inviting musicians, establishing fees, confirming a venue, talking to donors and sponsors, selecting a play list, and looking forward with anticipation to seeing new and returning students!

The Camp traditionally runs Tuesday through Friday of the first week of August. With only four days to become performance ready, there is no room for delay! Tuesday is a rapid-fire assessment day and finds Campers and musicians breaking off into groups based on instrument of choice: brass, guitar, bass, percussion, and keyboards! Vocalists also find a home room ASAP. Practicing professional musicians and their interns, the latter previous campers themselves, quickly determine who should be in which room, who should practice with which musician, who would be best at this or that song, this or that instrument in this or that song, who should solo and who should harmonize! It's fast and furious and by day the end of the day everybody is learning performance pieces. By rehearsal on Friday morning, the 50+ campers are in unison: buzzing like a hive and ready for show-time!

All joy and enthusiasm aside, the pandemic has been hard on the Camp: our instructors/musicians and sponsor/restaurants have suffered significantly over the past two years. In light of this we are extremely grateful to those who have continued to help out the Camp. Without their help we could not have operated the Camp. Trudy Lynn – Golden Girl (Nola Blue Records)

Born in Houston Texas, Trudy Lynn is truly a vocalist with incredible staying power in the Blues music business. She found her calling as an RnB/Blues singer, while still in high school, when the late "Telecaster Master" **Albert Collins** got her up on stage with him, to sing **Sam Cooke's; "A Change is Gonna Come" and Barrett Strong's; "Money"**.

Her very first single release, **"Long Live the Blues"**, came in 1973 on the small Sinett record label and her first album release, **"Trudy Sings the Blues"**, appeared on Ichiban Records.

As she was forging her multi decade career (57 years and counting), Ms. Lynn accumulated no less than **13 Blues Music Award nominations** and continues to amaze, with her 14th nomination this year, for **Best Soul Blues Female Artist**. This is one time when her nickname and album title, "**Golden Girl**", truly reflects the quality and the class of the entertainer, as she approaches her 75th birthday.

Raccoon Records describes Ms. Lynn as a; "powerhouse", "charismatic diva" and "dynamo"; and the proof is in this recording as she exudes vocal style, confidence and creative sensibility with her material.



Golden Girl kicks off with **"Tell Me"**, a guitar driven, modern funk rocker that finds her confronting her lover's wandering ways; "you give me more excuses than love." It's time to move forward or move on.

Next up is Lynn's self-penned; **"Golden Girl Blues"**, as she pokes fun at herself with her reflections on aging. Some effective Vaudeville style horn jabs and understated organ shots drive this along to her humorous rap at the end. To me it's always refreshing to hear an entertainer lighten up a bit and she obviously knows whereof she speaks, or in this case sings.

"If the Phone Don't Ring", is in the Chicago Blues style, once again with horn layers and some haunting Steve Krase harp, moving it forward. It finds our love weary, much abused protagonist saying she's had it up to her ears. She's gone and don't expect a phone call.

"I'm Just Saying" uses the often iterated modern phrase to lay it on the line, implying no B S intended. We used to call that telling it like it is and the tune utilizes some cool harp licks, some roadhouse piano and a chunky New Orleans drum beat that steals the show.

My fav cut on **"Golden Girl"** is a soulful ballad, drenched in heart felt emotion and sincerity, that other purveyors of Soul ballads could never hope to attain. **"Is it Cold in Here"** is one of the best I've ever heard in my 60 years of listening to heart tugging Blues and RnB, beautifully describing that "too far gone to turn around" moment.

"Trouble with Love", finds Ms. Lynn reflecting on the difficulty of sorting through all the bad actors out there, to find a man who's; "A credit to his gender". Stalwart guest guitarist, **Anson Funderburg**, gets to let loose on this one and a constant thumping bass drum draws you right into the frustrating quest.

"Take Me Back" is pure early 50's RnB, just before Rock 'n Roll gained its foothold. The RnB groove continues with; **"Live with Yourself"**, a contemplative **Hi Records** clone, with an Al Green type groove that would have **Willie Mitchell** smiling down from above. Friend and guest, **Teresa James**, steps up here on keys and vocal support. It's all about living with the choices we make in life.

"Heartache is a One Way Street", takes a hard look at lost love and a Bo Diddley incessant beat propels us down that street where looking back is often futile. But the closer, "Life Goes On", sung here with passion, drama and style, reminds us that we need to keep moving forward. It's a positive and welcome ending after a playlist addressing; love lost and fading, life's difficult choices, self doubt and yes, even aging. It's all about staying the course when necessary. In all, the "Golden Girl" song selection and the production team have brought out the best in Ms. Lynn, both vocally and stylistically.

In summary, Trudy Lynn is one artist who deserves a lot of respect from both her peers and Blues fans alike. She's still at the top of her game at age 75 and this recording just cements her reputation further in the Blues community.

TBS Maple Blues Award "Blues Booster of the Year!

The Toronto Blues Society's Board of Director s selects and recognizes the outstanding contributions to the Canadian Blues music industry by honouring a worthy candidate with a Maple Blues Award for, "Blues Booster of the Year". A trip to the Maple Blues Awards archives to get a sense of what it takes to be recognized and given the title of Blues Booster. Although contributions have been made through different vehicles within the industry, there is a shared passion and dedication to the Blues that leads the way. This year, the special acknowledgement will be granted to two individuals who have certainly made significant contributions. Like many previous honourees, although the contributions have been made in different ways – and in different parts of the country the impact of both works is considerable - and ongoing. In discussing what it meant for each of them to receive this year's honour, that commonality of passion emerged from their independent journeys, giving others a sense of what it means to be a "Blues Booster". Thank you to Erin McCallum for writing the article for the Toronto Blues Society's Newsletter.

One of the Recipients this year is none other than one of our founding directors, Claude Cloutier.

Claude found his way to the Blues via a fundraising event in 1999, Blues on The East Side was born, and Claude Cloutier's journey of becoming a Blues Booster had begun. Although, most people know his association with the Kitchener Blues Festival along with the Grand River Blues Society which has been in operation for almost 20 years itself. Serving as the Artistic Director initially for the GRBS and longstanding Vice President he then assumed the additional role of Artistic Director for the Kitchener Blues Festival. Another standout quality to Cloutier's involvement in both the Kitchener Blues Festival and the Grand River Blues Society is the opportunities to involve and showcase youth. This ongoing effort to interest, inspire, and include another generation of Blues lovers and players serves as evidence of Cloutier's passion and commitment to the Blues, and it is seen in programs such as Blues In The Schools (B.I.T.S.), Youth Blues Camp, and the Youth Blues



Challenge. When asked what being recognized as a "Blues Booster" means to him, Claude Cloutier is quick to share the credit.
