### The Vaudevillian





# 2022 Blues Music Awards Winners the Blues Foundation Memphis TN

Bay Area guitarist Tommy Castro was the big winner at the annual Blues Music Awards, held the first week in May from Memphis. Castro took home three top prizes including the coveted B.B. King Entertainer of the Year Award and Album of the Year honors for his LP "A Bluesman Came to Town." Castro's group, The Painkillers, also earned the Band of the Year award.

Presented by the Memphis-based Blues Foundation, the Blues Music Awards recognize the year's exceptional achievements in blues music recording, performance, and song writing. # ARE YOU READY ! GRAND RIVER BLUES CAMP ... IT'S BACK !!!

# August 2 – 5, 2022 8:30a.m.-3:30p.m.

#### Cameron Heights Collegiate, 301 Charles St. E. Kitchener, ON (LRT at the door)

Like everything else around the globe, for the past two years the pandemic prevented the GRBS Blues Camp from taking place. Every year for the previous eleven, the week immediately prior to the TD KBF saw 50+ students and approximately a dozen amazing local musicians, jamming in empty School Board classrooms, learning how to play instruments, sing songs, and become musicians in a band and performance context.

2020 was to have been the 20th anniversary of the TD Kitchener Blues Festival and the 11th for the Camp. Springing forward to 2022, we're re-setting the clock and going for broke! Dennis Cuomo and George White, along with long time Musical Director Don Featherstone, Camp Directors Janet Wendell and Neil Tarswell as well GRBS representative Brenda Thyer, have been busy! On their work roster have been the tasks of inviting musicians, establishing fees, confirming a venue, talking to donors and sponsors, selecting a play list, and looking forward with anticipation to seeing new and returning students!

The Camp traditionally runs Tuesday through Friday of the first week of August. With only four days to become performance ready, there is no room for delay! Tuesday is a rapid-fire assessment day and finds Campers and musicians breaking off into groups based on instrument of choice: brass, guitar, bass, percussion, and keyboards! Vocalists also find a home room ASAP. Practicing professional musicians and their interns, the latter previous campers themselves, quickly determine who should be in which room, who should practice with which musician, who would be best at this or that song, this or that instrument in this or that song, who should solo and who should harmonize! It's fast and furious and by day the end of the day everybody is learning performance pieces. By rehearsal on Friday morning, the 50+ campers are in unison: buzzing like a hive and ready for show-time!

All joy and enthusiasm aside, the pandemic has been hard on the Camp: our instructors/musicians and sponsor/restaurants have suffered significantly over the past two years. In light of this we are extremely grateful to those who have continued to help out the Camp. Without their help we could not have operated the Camp. 

# Bettye Smith – The Good, The Bad and The Bettye (Ruf Records)

Bettye Smith, who will be appearing at this year's TD Kitchener Blues Fest, is the epitome of the word survivor. It wasn't enough that she was raised in Brooklyn's rough and tumble **Bedford- Stuyvesant** area (Bed-Stuy to the locals), she also suffered a deep personal hurt, that clung to her for years. I'll elaborate later in this review.

Ms. Smith is not your average Blues singer. Her Rockin' RnB, take no prisoners approach to her repertoire and vocals, will grab your attention from the first song and won't let go. With this recording, The Good The Bad and The Bettye, you'll hear her full range of musical influences, from gospel she heard in church to Soul music heard on the street corners. Wrap this in a blanket of Rock with a huge growling, insistent voice and you've got the makings of a truly diverse, what'll she do next, recording. Ms. Smith had a vision for the album and her producer, **Matt Patton (Drive By Truckers)**, totally got what



she was looking for. He immediately enlisted fellow (DBT) member, Patterson Hood, and North Mississippi Allstar, Luther Dickinson, to guest and provide creativity. The result is an album that's musically solid with just enough quirkiness to stand above the crowd.

**"Fistful of Dollars"** is the funky hard driving opener and the band is cookin' from the start. Horns punch out a relentless groove, while the chunky guitar wraps that groove so tight that it's a dancer's delight. Dare you not to shake your thing on this cut.

**"Whistle Stop"** really showcases Ms. Smith's voice, which conjures up a little **Betty Lavette**, a little **Macie Gray** and a little **Tina Turner**. It's the recollection of an ill-fated love that cuts like a knife and you can feel every drop of pain in her vocal.

# Willy A's Blues Music Reviews (con't)

"I'm a Sinner" really rocks the Blues and she bares her soul to mistakes made in the past that we all can surely relate to. Interesting too, how the song fades out to what appears to be an impromptu out take, with thirty seconds of vocal and acoustic guitar. One of those quirky moments that's very cool.

"I Felt It Too" is pure Rock, utilizing some interesting fuzz box guitar riffs.

Next up is **"Signs and Wonders"**, which unexpectedly relaxes the listener in a Southern Rock and Soul style, nicely helped along by **Luther Dickinson's** subtle, understated guitar.

The ability of the album to switch gears from Soul to Blues to Pop friendly tunes, while always keeping a Rock undercurrent, is what I feel, gives Ms. Smith her edge over other artists of the Neo-Soul era.

**"Song For a Friend"**, one of her Pop friendly tunes, is all about the people who are there for you when the times get tough while other so-called friends pull a disappearing act. This is followed by the slow Blues-Rock confession, **"Pine Belt Blues"** ("I was lost; now I'm found"), utilizing a full choir to gospelize the message.

**"Everybody Needs Love"** is a slow Rocker that maybe is stating the obvious but sometimes we lose the message and think we can go it on our own. Not easily done. Nice tune for jolting us back to reality. Ms. Smith apparently lost a family member and it haunted her for years. But she's finally reached that elusive mindset of acceptance and this song seems to reflect that transformation. She's moved on and this recording reflects the many stages her life has gone through.

Facing your demons and finally being able to express your feelings in words/songs is a huge step forward. She expresses it clearly in the closing number, **"Don't Skip Out On Me"**. Although not stated in any liner notes, the song reflects heavily on her mother, who abandoned her in her youth. It's very heartfelt.

In summary, this is a unique recording, produced by **Matt Patton**. There's a little musical something for everyone here and Bettye Smith is a true chameleon of styles and genres. I'm looking forward to catching her live show at the **2022 TD Kitchener Blues Festival** and co-incidentally, her producer's band, **Drive By Truckers**, is playing the festival as well. It's a great opportunity to check them both out. See you there.
